SUBJECT: APPLICATIONS FOR NOMINATION OF CANDIDATES AS BOARD OF PODIATRIC MEDICINE MEDICAL CONSULTANTS

ACTION: REVIEW AND NOMINATE CANDIDATES FOR APPROVAL

RECOMMENDATION

Review and nominate candidates for approval by the Board of Podiatric Medicine ("BPM") as podiatric medical consultants.

ISSUE

Two candidates seek approval of applications for nomination as BPM medical consultants.

DISCUSSION

BPM medical consultants are podiatric physicians in good standing who are in practice or employed in the field of podiatric medicine in the community. BPM routinely utilizes podiatric medical consultant services on a part-time contract basis to review and evaluate quality of care issues as they arise.

The role of the podiatric medical consultant is to determine whether the care and treatment provided by a member of licensed podiatric community fell within the standard of practice. The podiatric medical consultant provides BPM with an informed, objective opinion regarding the standard of practice and provides an explanation as to the reasons that treatment or care may or may not have been appropriate on a case by case basis.

The standard of care is dynamic and allows for advancements in the field of medicine and the state of knowledge. Generally speaking the standard of practice reflects the skills, knowledge and professional practice in the community which is derived from a number of sources including, among others, medical textbooks, references and medical training from academic and professional education programs.

BPM has implemented a number of policy decisions concerning the minimum requirements for recruitment and selection of BPM podiatric medical consultants. Accordingly, pursuant to the policy provisions adopted by the Board and revised on February 11, 2011, the BPM Enforcement Committee shall review and nominate

applicants to the board for consideration and unanimous approval as DPM Medical Consultants.

The BPM Enforcement Committee may approve the application of a candidate for nomination if an applicant demonstrates satisfaction of the required criteria. The applicable BPM policy mandates are attached for Committee reference.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of this item will not have a significant financial impact on the Board of Podiatric Medicine's FY 14/15 Budget. Approved consultants are added to BPM's consultant pool to increase the numbers of available individuals that may be relied upon for case evaluation and review as needed. Services are remunerated at the going rate of \$75 per hour for each case reviewed. It is estimated that additional training costs may accrue at approximately \$300 per consultant during the mandated policy training cycle in addition to any travel and miscellaneous expenses.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS

Review and nomination is consistent with the Board's policy decisions concerning minimum requirements for the selection, nomination, recruitment and approval of new podiatric medical consultants as provided in:

- 1) Minimum Requirements for New Medical Consultants, Experts and Examiners (Revised February 11, 2011); and
- 2) Selection, Training and Evaluation of Board of Podiatric Medicine (BPM) Medical Consultants (Adopted February 11, 2011).

NEXT STEPS

With Committee consideration, staff will forward the applicant packages with corresponding recommendations to the full Board at the March 6, 2015 meeting.



POLICY DECISION: Minimum Requirements for New Medical Consultants, Experts, and Examiners

1. Hold a current, valid and unrestricted California license to practice podiatric medicine.
2. Be active in the practice of podiatric medicine in the subject area being reviewed.
3. Have completed a postgraduate medical education program approved by the Council on Podiatric Medical Education.
4. Be certified by the American Board of Podiatric Surgery and must maintain a current certificate.
5. Have surgical staff privileges in at least one general acute care hospital facility.
6. Must not have been subject to disciplinary action by the BPM, i.e., the filing of an Accusation or Statement of Issues that was not withdrawn or dismissed.
7. Must not be under BPM investigation for a violation of any laws relating to the practice of medicine at the time of appointment or be the subject of such a case pending in the Attorney General's office.
8. Must not have been the subject of a field investigation by the BPM within the last five (5) years that was not closed and deleted from Medical Board records.
9. In the event of a conflict of interest, must recuse themselves from the review or examination.
10. Must not misrepresent his or her credentials, qualifications, experience or background.

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POLICY DECISION: Selection, Training and Evaluation of Board of Podiatric Medicine (BPM) Medical Consultants

1. Potential DPM Medical Consultants shall be reviewed and nominated to the Consultant pool by the Board's Enforcement Committee.
2. New candidates must be approved by unanimous vote of the Board Members present at a noticed public meeting.
3. Following approval by the Board, Consultants shall certify in writing prior to beginning work that they have received and read the current *BPM Enforcement Manual*.
4. Likewise, all consultants shall so certify receipt and reading of each revision to the *BPM Enforcement Manual*.
5. Consultants shall be evaluated at least on an annual basis.
6. Staff shall organize training sessions for consultants every two years as practicable, and each working consultant must have participated in a BPM training session before beginning work and within the past four years at all times.
7. Consultants may serve for eight consecutive years, and have at least a two-year break in service before being eligible for re-nomination by the Enforcement Committee.
